A seasoned, clogging prospector quickly seizes the opportunity to explore a newly Establish ed workshop/competition. Being part of this adventurous group, I was drawn to the Salt City Festival. It was held at the Holiday Inn, in Liverpool New York. Although in its infancy it was very well organized. Salt City's successful launch can be credited to Johanna Healy, the WNYCA, and their years of experience.

If curiosity kills the cat, I am the walking dead. I had to know the story behind this new workshop, so a talked with Johanna about it. "I have always had a desire to introduce a competition to this area. I also al-

ways knew that meant another event, because Nickel City has its very distinct culture and identity—a competition component would alter that too much, and that is a change that is not best for that event. Mike, the kids and I stayed at the Holiday Inn Liverpool passing through to the Adirondacks for a family vacation and the wheels started turning—proximity to two major interstates caught my eye immediately and I knew the area well since I lived down the street during law school. A couple of weeks after that, I was able to spend some time talking to Dale Burl and Richard Hawker of the Erie Canal Cloggers. They have always been such great supporters of WNYCA and I knew that they wanted to have an event closer to the central NY area. We talked for close to two hours about how and why to have an event in Syracuse, and what we could do to make it successful. That discussion with Dale and Richard in October of 2014 is what started Salt City. Lots of discussions between us and the board in the following months led to the board of directors approving the event the following spring, and it took shape for us to host the first Salt City in September 2016." Johanna has great intuition. This workshop has had increasing attendance, and those who came to compete were excited to have the opportunity to do so.

Everyone loosened up at the fun dance Friday night. Classes started at 9am Saturday and ran straight through, no lunch break, till 5. Three halls were opened, and all skill levels were offered. The Featured Instructors were Andy Howard, Andrew Perry, Chip Summey, and Judy Waymouth. Andy Howard always selects music that is a bit off the beaten path. This is an intentional decision on his part, to give the attendees more to choose from. At Salt City he presented Sir Duke an advanced R&B, Michigrass Set and Royals

both Bluegrass, and Gravel Walk an Irish tune. Andy often teaches a routine and then shows advanced substitutions steps. His joy of dance is obvious! I first met Andrew Perry ten years ago. He was a young talented boy, wildly dancing all over the place. He has been teaching for several years, and is finally settling into his own style, no longer looking at others for direction. Andrew's strong points are his cueing, very clear and rhythmic and his ability to keep a fun dance running! Chip Summey with all his southern charm continues to fill halls. He came armed with country, four to be exact. Many dancers picked his Hot Rod Roller. Chip always delivers great routines, a class filled with laughter, and at least one pull back! If you are looking for a workout look no further than a class with Judy Waymouth, a powerhouse dancer from Canada. She shows a step several times, then says just once more, but that really means several more times. She has great routines, great music selections, great presentation, great sense of humor, and that sums up Judy Waymouth! Other instructors included Bekka Gunner, if you are looking for advanced she is your gal. Monique Martineau shared both a pop and country routine. Colleen Zurbrigg brought two



routines. Colleen's Howdy Neighbor Howdy was a fun class. Katrina Kaplan presented an advanced routine.

This annual National Clogging Competition is an Invitational event only and culmination of the top 3 age division winners from NCHC competition sanction events series that begins each August 1 through July 31 of each year.
