

The event is divided into 4 Divisions– Amateur Division I (Pee Wee through Junior), Amateur Division II (Senior through Adult), and repeated age divisions for Master Level Teams. Teams who that attend NCHC sanctioned competitions and place 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> or 3<sup>rd</sup> receive an invitation to dance at the event. Each team who places 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> or 3<sup>rd</sup> at this years event is extended an invitation to return next year to the USA National Championships to defend their titles next year held Labor Day weekend 2020 at the Gaylord Opryland Hotel as well.

This two day, two stage event comprised over 300 team dances, 110 duos/ duets, 350 solos, 50 choreographed solos, comprising over 600 competition dancers from AR, CO, FL, GA, IN, KY, MD, ME, MO, MS, MT, NC, NE, SC, TN, and TX.



- The scholarship cannot be applied to franchise sponsored CCI Sessions, it can only be applied to CCI Sessions offered by CLOG such as sessions offered during the National CLOG Convention.
  - The scholarship must be used in the same year it is awarded.
  - The minimum age limit for CCI seminars and the scholarship is 16 years of age.

Letters of Application will be accepted from January 1, 2020 through April 30, 2020. Applicants will be notified by May 31, 2020.
