1st CANADIAN NATIONAL CLOGGING CONVENTION THE WOODSTALK OF CLOGGING WORKSHOPS



Saturday evening, a teary eyed, Colleen Zurbrigg thanked, the pioneers who brought clogging to Ontario, Jack and Dorothy McCulloch. This is a short history. In 1977 this couple seen a clogging demonstration in Atlantic City. They went to Houston Texas and learned as much as they could about clogging. October 24, 1978 the Ontario Rhythm Cloggers group was formed. It was a very successful group. In December 1995 the name Ontario Rhythm Cloggers retired along with Jack and Dorothy. In 2002 Dorothy brought the Ontario Rhythm Cloggers

name out of retirement and passed the name to Colleen Zurbrigg, a huge honor that is well deserved!

Fifteen different clogging groups put on exhibitions with each country represented. The following groups were fantastic, Ontario Rhythm Cloggers, Nathan Ballard & Amanda Lim, Active Lifestyle Centre Double Steppers, Klepeto's Czech Republic, Kick Up A Fuss Cloggers, Shane Gang, German Cloggers, Huron County Cloggers, WNYCA & Friends, Canadian Country Cruiser, Cold Creek/Quinte Bay Cloggers, and Judy School of Dance.
