USA Joins the World in Celebrating Clog Dancing

The Online event honors Bill Nichols, the "Grandfather of Modern Clogging"

August 8th, 2020 is being recognized as the first annual National Day of Clogging and the International Day of Clog Dancing as a celebration of the contributions of the late Bill Nichols, affectionately known as "The Grandfather of Modern Clogging".

The National Day of Clogging and the International Day of Clog Dancing (the words clogging and clog dancing can be used interchangeably) will give dancers from around the globe the opportunity to build awareness of the dance and the many contributions of Bill Nichols.

Growing up in the mountains of Western North Carolina and East Tennessee, Nichols' sharing of clogging with tourists at Fontana Village Resort created a ripple effect that took the dance across the country and abroad.

Nichols is credited as being the first person in America to give terminology, structure, and organization to this American folk dance that was a "melting pot" of percussive dances from any cultures. He created a dance movement that has resulted in elevating a regional recreational activity to a national competitive platform with international acclaim. "He never made his work about "him," said his daughter Simone Nichols Pace, who is coordinating the event. "His work was always for the benefit of future generations of dancers. Around the world, this is a day of celebration of our talents and a day of reverence for those who came before us. We can put our dancers in the spotlight and generate a multitude of publicity which will inevitably open many more doors of opportunity," Pace said.

The culture that clogging instructors cultivate through the dance and for the clog dance families can be a bond for bringing our diverse cultures together to share the bonds of fun and friendship. Especially in these times, dance instructors are introducing many people to dance for fun and fitness via the internet. Bill Nichols believed that the best way to reduce cultural bias is to show someone you care, share a meal, share a laugh, share a photograph, and share a dance. Bill would agree with diversity and inclusion expert Verna Myers: "Diversity is being invited to the party; inclusion is being asked to dance." He may also add that leadership is "calling" the dance. By developing this culture during weekly dance classes, the reach into other areas of life can be extended. Dance instructors influence the minds and attitudes of those who dance with them.

Through the National Day of Clogging and International Day of Clog Dancing on August 8, 2020 we will celebrate our history, encourage diversity and inclusion, and create a brighter future for our dancers. We can make a difference.

He was also the founder and first president of The National Clogging and Hoedown Council, the first American clogging organization. He was instrumental in establishing the first standardized rules of competitive clogging in America.

Keep clogging and carry on Pchajek teaching clogging classes online

Darolyn Pchajek knows how to put her best foot forward.

In light of the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic and social distancing measures, the longtime clogging instructor and proprietor of Dare to Clog Dancers is currently livestreaming her regular classes on her YouTube channel — Dare to Clog — on Monday and Thursday evenings. She has also started classes for beginners on Tuesday and Friday mornings.



"I'd been regularly teaching at Harrow United Church, and they said I can still use the church for my classes if I want to," said Pchajek, who lives in south St. Vital. "I now have more than 200 views per night, and participants can follow the livestream or watch it after the fact. I know so many people are thankful they're able to take part like this. I've also started a beginner's class for people starting from scratch."

It's fair to say Pchajek, 52, has become a big presence in the clogging world, especially in North America. She has travelled extensively in the U.S., appearing at numerous workshops and conventions through the years, and she was the featured instructor at the 2018 National Clogging Convention in Burnie, Tasman

On home soil, the married mother of three — she taught clogging throughout all three pregnancies — was a key figure at the inaugural Canadian National Clogging Convention in Waterloo, Ont. last October. Locally, she a member of the Clogging Leaders' Association of Manitoba, along with Gerald Laking in Winnipeg, Heather Kerr and Lyndsey Simpson in Portage la Prairie, and Barb Berry in Brandon. ia.

"I'm truly blessed to be able to do what I love," said Pchajek, noting her youngest child — 13-year-old Andrew — has "gotten into it, too" and joins her for the classes, making it a family affair.

To alleviate any possible confusion, Pchajek points out that clogging dancers don't wear clogs — they wear tap shoes. In fact, many former tap dancers have joined her classes. As people get older, clogging tends to be easier on the knees and the joints, she said.

A quick glance at the sample cue sheets on Pchajek's website shows clogging can be performed to any number of musical genres, including rock, pop, country and bluegrass.

And as the popularity of her YouTube classes to continues to grow, Pchajek is inviting potential new participants to join her for the dance.

"If anyone's interested, I hope in-person classes will be resuming in September, if things are back to normal by then," she said.



"One good thing about going digital is that you can try it from the comfort of your own living room and see if you like it."

Faces of Arts & Culture: With over 40 years of dance experience, Tammy Leehy continues to safely teach during pandemic

Tammy Leehy, owner of Miss Tammy's School of Dance in Neola, has been teaching dance classes at the studio since it opened in 2002.

Leehy obtained her bachelor's degree in elementary education and coaching from Midland Lutheran College (now Midland University) in 1992.

She said her reasoning for opening a dance studio was her love of dance and coaching children.

"Coaching children to be the best they can be and build self confidence is the best reward for me," she said.

Leehy has been dancing for 43 years, and has taught for 34.

"I grew up dancing at a small studio in Elkhorn, Nebraska," she said. "At this studio, I was able to compete nationally back in the late '80s where we were crowned National Champions for our production ballet routine 'Rodeo'."

She has performed in local community productions of "My Fair Lady" and "Oklahoma." In addition to productions, she has attended many Dance Olympus and Tremaine Dance workshops in Omaha and Tennessee.

"My favorite style of dance is a hard one to answer because I love them all," she said. "I lean towards clogging due to it's upbeat tempo and unique style."

She has also attended numerous clogging workshops locally and nationally. Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the studio closed temporarily in the spring but reopened on June 10 with limited class sizes and social distancing.

"We stopped our in-person studio classes on March 16," she said. "That week, we started doing three Facebook Live sessions five days a week."

Teachers then began making weekly videos for every one of the classes they had. Students were able to access them on YouTube so they could practice all week.

The purpose of the videos was to continue to teach their upcoming recital dances, she said. After about a month of videos, she started doing live Zoom classes with each class.

The studio opened back up on June 10 with limited class sizes and social distancing. Zoom classes are still available to students who don't feel comfortable coming back.

Right now, the lobby area is closed in the studio. Precautions being taken so the studio can open include:

- Parents drop dancers off outside and wait for their teacher to open the door before they can enter
- Hand sanitizer at the front door of each studio
- Everything is sanitized after each class
- Spots are marked on the outskirts of the studio floor at least 6-feet apart
- Only three studios are in use right now and each of them is limited to 50% capacity.
